Fort Worth, TX – Susan G. Komen Greater Kansas City was recognized for its innovative mission work at the breast cancer organization's annual Leadership Conference in Fort Worth, TX this weekend. The local Komen Affiliate received "The Promise Award," named in honor of the promise to end breast cancer Komen's founder made to her dying sister, Susan Komen. The award recognizes the organization's Affiliate that has demonstrated a commitment to forward thinking in reducing overall breast cancer mortality, as well as disparities in breast cancer mortality.

Through a variety of programs and initiatives Komen Kansas City has worked tirelessly to become a true catalyst for change within their community by providing meaningful education, increased funding and influential marketing campaigns. Based on the needs outlined in their community profile, they funded multiple grants geared towards helping minority women in need. Additionally, they have continued to address the barriers that many women face when it comes to breast health, partnering with various individuals within the community to address them.

One of their largest initiatives was the Wyandotte County Breast Cancer Taskforce, which addresses the concerns of late-stage breast cancer diagnoses. In addition, Komen KC partnered with other state cancer organizations to pass oral chemotherapy legislation. They have also positioned themselves as a leader in regional collaboration for Breast Cancer Awareness month, helping to share their professional knowledge as is relates to mission and marketing.
